I'm sorry to hear that aunt Myra has gone back to Orange. You'll have to send me her address: I promised to write to her.

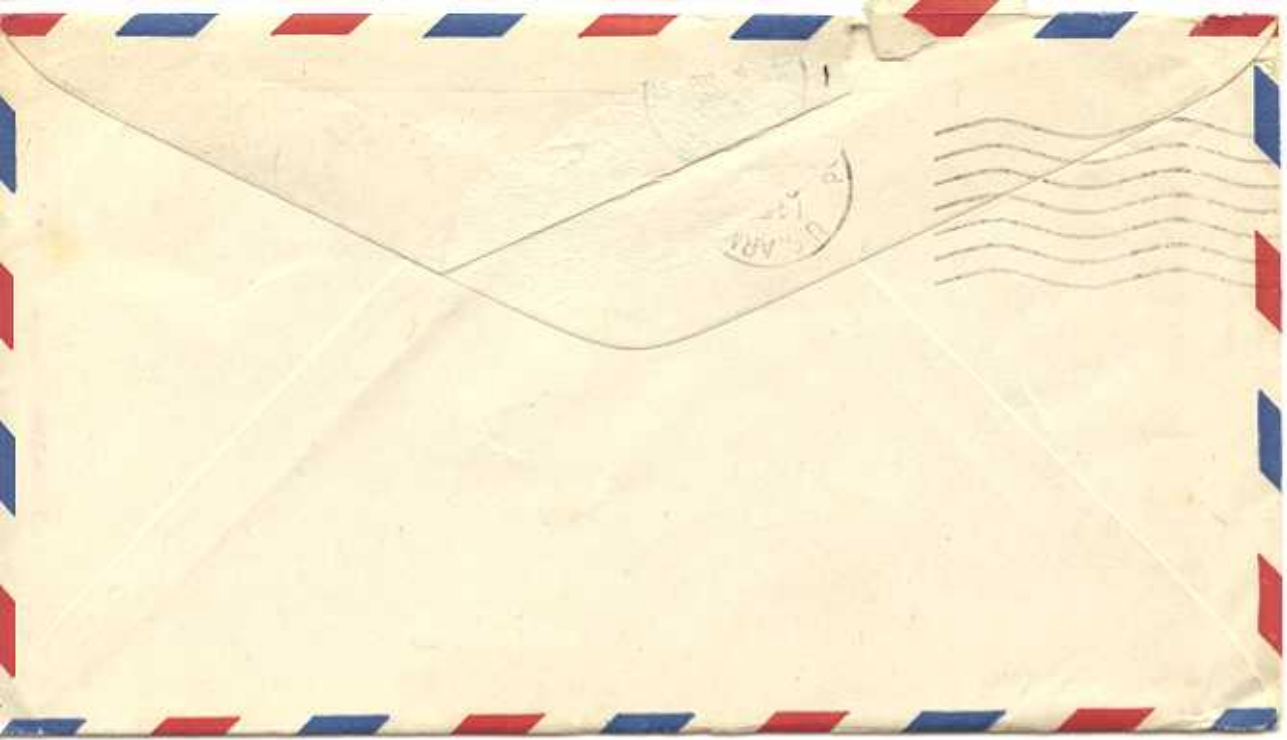
