


MAJOR BILL

LT. RONALD POLAND, RADAR OBSERVER, AIR FORCE ADVISER ATTACHED TO 120TH FIGHTER GROUP FOR APPROXIMATELY TWO WEEKS, DIED 18 APRIL 1960 IN SAME CRASH WITH MAJOR LEWIS. AN EAGER FLYER, WELL LIKED, THE UNIT REGRETS HIS LOSS. HE WAS 25 YEARS OLD AND LEAVES WIFE SARAH AND 2 CHILDREN. HOME TOWN, WACO, TEXAS.

Major Lewis, Senior Pilot, Air Force Senior Adviser attached to 120th Fighter Group for 32 years, died 18 April 1960 in Aircraft Crash at Great Falls Internation— Al Airport.

A MAN ENDEARED TO ALL GUARDSMEN OF THE 120TH. MAJOR BILL WILL NEVER BE FORGOTTEN. HE WAS 39 YEARS OLD AND LEAVES WIFE JUNE, AND 3 CHILDREN. HOME TOWN, HOUSTON, TEXAS.
